

# Introduction


Kilkenny County Council is currently in the early stages of developing a greenway between Woodstock Estate, near Inistioge, Co. Kilkenny, and the South East Greenway at New Ross Co. Wexford. This project is funded by Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII). RPS have been appointed by Kilkenny County Council to provide multidisciplinary consultancy services to progress the project through the design and planning stages, following Phases 1-4 of the TII Project Management Guidelines. We are currently in Phase 1 of the development and entering into our first period of public consultation.

## **Key Information**

## **Project Benefits**

The proposed Greenway will promote sustainable economic growth within Inistioge, New Ross and surrounding local communities, through improved recreational amenities and connectivity, increased tourism potential, and a shift from car trips to active travel. By creating a safe route for pedestrians, cyclists and other users, the Greenway will encourage active travel and reduce reliance on cars, thereby lowering carbon emissions. Additionally, it will attract visitors to explore the scenic landscapes and serve as a link to existing recreational routes, such as the South East Greenway and Nore Valley Walks, and the numerous tourism attractions in the area. This will enhance Woodstock, Inistioge and New Ross, as key destinations for walking, cycling, and outdoor enthusiasts.

## **Project Opportunities**

The proposed project aims to enhance the local and regional walking and cycling recreational network, in particular serving as a link to the South East Greenway, Nore Valley Walks, East Kilkenny Cycle Route and the South Leinster Way. The proposed Greenway has the potential to boost tourism in the area, including increased visitor numbers to Woodstock Estate and Inistioge Village and other local attractions.

## **Project Objectives**

The key objectives of this project are to provide a greenway which is sustainable, accessible, safe, and attractive for locals and visitors. In achieving these objectives, the project will facilitate:

**Transport User and Economic Benefits** Support connectivity and economic growth in Inistioge, New Ross and surrounding communities.

#### Social

Enhance social inclusion and promote healthier communities in Inistioge, New Ross and elsewhere along the route.

#### Safety

Provide safe and accessible infrastructure, which improves safety and security for walkers, cyclists and other greenway users.

#### Accessibility

Promote modal shift and connectivity/accessibility to existing amenities, services and facilities.



#### **Climate Change**

Contribute to the offsetting/reduction in greenhouse gas emissions and to the robustness and resilience to negative climate change effects.



#### Local Environment

Increase public appreciation of the natural environment and local heritage, while protecting and enhancing natural assets and biodiversity.




#### Land Use

Support and facilitate the implementation of sustainable transport policies and increase connectivity between Inistioge, New Ross and other locations in the wider region.



#### Best Practice

Follow the Code of Best Practice National and Regional Greenways to maximise the use of State-owned lands and minimise potential impacts on privately-owned lands, where the project objectives can be satisfactorily achieved.  $\checkmark$ 



# What is Happening Now?

The project is currently at Phase 1 Concept and Feasibility. The purpose of Phase 1 is to develop and investigate in further detail, the feasibility of the project and to identify a suitable Study Area for the examination of preliminary options.

#### Public Consultation No.1 on the Study Area will take place between 17th February and 14th March 2025.

We will continue to carry out technical and environmental assessments while incorporating stakeholder feedback from the first public consultation. This will enable the project to progress to Phase 2, which involves Options Selection. A second public consultation on the project's Proposed Route Corridors will be held later in 2025 as part of Phase 2.


